

Code 1336. Diversified Support for a Diverse Labour Market! Targeted Government Policies for the Integration of (Different Groups of) Migrants into Employment

Duración/Length: 120 minutes

The workshop will offer an international comparison of current governmental instruments aimed at improving the integration of migrants in national labour market. As statistics show, in most countries migrants face significant difficulties to find employment in comparison to the native population. Unemployment and employment which is not suited to one's qualifications are crucial obstacles to full inclusion in society. The challenges are multiple-for these reasons, diversified solutions are required. FOCI of the workshop will be: 1) policies and instruments targeting migrants with foreign qualifications; 2) initiatives to bring refugees into employment; 3) measures aimed at tapping the labour market potential of foreign students, during as well as after their studies In this workshop we want to look at governmental instruments, strategies and tools to successfully integrate internationally trained individuals into the labour market with examples from Canada, Germany and New Zealand.
